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10/5/22 Important Information Regarding Rosebank PS Little Big Scrub

Dear Parents,

Rosebank PS Little Big Scrub kicks off this Wednesday. Our journey of learning discovery will take us on and off the school site, down to the Rosebank Reserve and to other sites in our local area. Parents will be informed if we require a bus trip or excursion off site.

On the Reserve, children will be undertaking Science and Technology, Literacy, Numeracy, Environmental, Geography and History outcomes. We will be investigating animal habitats, native flora and fauna, engaging in mapping activities, creating botanical drawings, looking, listening and smelling our new learning environment.

Our aims are to assist students to connect with our natural environment in deeper ways, designing learning experiences that inspire and achieve our curriculum outcomes. It is our belief that our students benefit from a learning environment away from the 'four walls' of a classroom.

Risk Management:

Children will cross the road in small groups, accompanied by a teacher and will be supervised by a second adult on the other side. They will be supervised by at least two adults when offsite and onsite. We always have a first aid kit and 2-way radio system that we use. We have use of a composting toilet and shelter at the Reserve but these are only short trips from our school. The Reserve is maintained by a group of local volunteers who are delighted our school will be using it for the purpose it was intended.

A car will be taken when offsite or at the Reserve. Should a child require urgent medical assistance an ambulance will be contacted and covered through our School Ambulance Cover. The remaining staff would accompany the rest of the students back to school. As is already the case, if a child is injured at school and needs on-site assessment or ambulance transport, an ambulance would be called to the school. In such cases, transport costs are met by the Department of Education and not the parents of the child treated.

It is essential that the school always has up-to-date student medical information and contact information for your child. Please make sure that you have provided up to date information, so that we have all the information we need to take care of your child, in the case of an emergency.
