**Let's bust some LICE BUSTING MOVES**

Thank you for sharing with us on FaceBook the struggles that some of you have been having with Head Lice. Some families spend a lot of time and money each year fighting off the little blighters. So, we are making some moves to try and get things better managed. First, we have had a massive crack-down on hats. Children must wear their own hat. They are encouraged to leave them at school, preferably in their tote tray, so they are always on hand. No spare hats are available. If a child does not have their hat, they can't play outside. As well:

1. If a child comes to school with head lice, they will receive a note asking for their lice to be treated. Parents should treat their hair, sign the note and return it to school with their child, so that other families can feel assured that children can work and play together without being re-infested
2. If your child has Head Lice, please tell the school as soon as you know. We will send out a note to everyone in their class that day, advising them and asking them to check and treat their child/children as necessary
3. Another strategy we are considering is a Nitbuster Day. If we went ahead, parent volunteers would screen and treat any children whose parents have given consent. This will be discussed at our next P&C, once we see how other moves work.
